THE DEPARTMENT DISMAYED BY THE FIRE INCIDENT AT DUMELANI SECONDARY SCHOOL

The Mpumalanga Department of Education is deeply dismayed to learn of the fire that broke out at Dumelani Secondary School in Thembisile Hani West Circuit in Mathysensloop in Nkangala District.

It is said that this incident happened in the early hours of Saturday, 01 March 2025 and the preliminary reports indicate that the entire administration block was completely gutted by the fire.

In response, the Department has instructed officials from the Infrastructure Directorate to assess the damage and provide a comprehensive report detailing the necessary steps for recovery and restoration.

A case of arson has been filed with the Kwaggafontein Police Station, who will investigate the circumstances surrounding the incident.

In the meantime, the Department will work closely with the school management team and the School Governing Body (SGB) to ensure that teaching and learning are not disrupted by this unfortunate event.

The situation at the school is being monitored closely.

The Department extends its deepest condolences to the family of the late learner. Our thoughts are with them as they mourn this unimaginable loss.

The Mpumalanga Department of Education is deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Banele Zwane, a 20-year-old Grade 12 learner from Lisushwana High School in Dundonald, Chief Albert Luthuli Local Municipality.

Tragically, Banele was struck by a scholar transport bus while walking with a schoolmate en route to school this morning, Monday, 17 March 2025, at approximately 07H00

According to the preliminary report from the school, an eyewitness indicated that the bus came from behind the two boys and struck Banele, who was walking on the right side of the road.

A case of culpable homicide has been opened at Biskop Police Station. The department will await the police report that will provide further details on the cause of this devastating incident.

On behalf of the Department, the MEC for Education has extended her heartfelt condolences to the bereaved family, relatives, close friends, and the entire school community.

The department will also deploy officials from the inclusive education and wellness section to provide psychosocial support to the family of the deceased and those affected by this profoundly sad event.

DEPARTMENT EXPRESSES CONCERN REGARDING DISTURBING VIDEO CIRCULATING ON SOCIAL MEDIA

The Mpumalanga Department of Education is deeply concerned over a video circulating on social media, which depicts an allegedly racially discriminatory incident at Laerskool Middelburg in the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality.

The said video features an audio recording of an individual, who is likely to be a school administrator or official from the school informing a parent seeking admission for her child for the 2026 school year, that black children are not allowed to attend in that school.

The Department takes this matter very serious and will be reaching out to the parent involved to initiate a thorough investigation into the incident.

The South African Constitution, adopted in 1996, is the supreme law of the Republic. Section 29 guarantees the right to basic education, including adult basic education, and the right to further education, which the state must progressively make available and accessible.

All public schools within the province are open and accessible to all children, regardless of race, colour, or religious belief.

Further details regarding this matter will be made available to the public once the investigation is completed.
